- Is a U.S. federally-funded program of the Guam Department of Public Health & Social Services (DPHSS) that was established in 2010;
- Is part of the DPHSS Bureau of Community Health Services (BCHS) and complements other critical health programs;
- Is located in the Guam Northern Regional Community Health Center (NRCHC). This facility provides health materials and resources focused on cancer, obesity and physical activity available free to the community;

Additionally:

- The GOMH supports community health fairs, school health education, policy development and health initiatives to promote healthier living;
- The creation of sustainable partnerships and collaborations are key elements in the GOMH process. These include local, regional, national and international networks;
- Cultural Competency and Linguistically Appropriate approaches to addressing health disparities are hallmarks of the GOMH services;
- The GOMH supports the Sexual Violence Prevention & Education Program (SVPEP) activities.
